The ESEA Can Ensure That Discipline Serves an Educational Mission

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Research Consensus: EFFECTIVE TEACHERS HAVE THE LARGEST IMPACT ON ACHIEVEMENT OUTCOMES

- Yet, poor and minority children have lower exposure to experienced and highly qualified teachers;
- Higher exposure to inadequate teachers also correlates with higher rates of suspension.

What We Are Learning: Middle School Predictors of Dropping Out


- Being suspended

Out of School Suspensions: Do Not Improve Behavior or Test Scores


- Research suggests that frequent use of suspensions begets more suspensions.
- Research shows that principal's attitudes drives suspension rates when other factors held constant.
- Positive Behavioral (PBS) show ways to reduce suspensions, that both improve school climate and that IMPROVE test scores.

Racial Impact of The Rising Use Of Suspension: K-12


Suspension as Percent of Enrollment By Race

National Middle School Suspension Rates by Race/Gender (OCR 2006)




Urban School Districts 2006: Comparison of National Middle School Suspension Rates (in OCR sample) with 18 Large Urban Districts

- 11% All races nationally
- 22% All races average across 18 large urban districts

- 28% For Black Males nationally
- Over 50% Black Males in Palm Beach and Milwaukee

Schools in Crisis: In 18 Urban Districts Many Middle Schools *Suspended Over One Third* of the Male Students (by race)



We Only Count Those Whom We Care About: ESEA Should Require Comprehensive Reporting on Discipline

- By race, ethnicity, gender, disability and ELL status;
- By grade level;
- By district and school level;
- By race w/gender;
- One day or more;
- In-school suspensions;
- Incidence and duration of suspension, disaggregated;
- Reasons for suspensions;
- Children in Juvenile Justice system

Discipline Centered on an Educational Mission: ESEA Can Provide Remedies

- 1. Funding to improve school environments through school-wide PBS.
- Ensure that poor and minority students have equitable access to highly qualified and effective teachers and principals
- Include discipline data when evaluating school and district performance.
- Provide incentives for schools to find effective alternatives to suspension and require interventions where necessary.
